A CRUCIAL ROLE IN SOCIETY

PROTECTING THE CONSUMER

The continuing expansion of the flexible and packaging films market is in no small measure dependent on maintaining consumer confidence.

PAFA is active in the development of both national and international quality standards and has pioneered the concept of quality assurance in order to help protect consumers in market areas such as cling, stretch and building films. Companies authorised to display the registered QA logo must undertake to maintain PAFA standards and the team of inspectors which polices the UK marketplace will seek to prosecute wherever suppliers are found to be cheating their customers.



LEGISLATION AND COMPETITION

PAFA representation becomes increasingly important as new legislation from Westminster and Brussels imposes additional administrative and cost burdens which directly impact on the ability of manufacturing businesses to compete in a global marketplace.

PAFA works with Government officials and other trade organisations during the consultation stages of new legislation and on a continuing basis in order to reduce the costs of compliance for film producers and maintain a fair and equitable trading environment. PAFA also compiles trade statistics and any unfair competition based on concealed State Aid or distortion of raw material pricing is strongly resisted in the interest of fair and open competition.

DEVELOPING GLOBAL MARKETS



The development and expansion of the European Union brings challenging opportunities in a market which knows no national boundaries. Equally rapid advances in information technology and the potential offered by e-commerce facilitate competitive international sourcing of raw materials and finished product. In turn, these very significant changes in the pattern of trade have served to bring about a totally new scale of industry restructuring.

For all these reasons, it has become imperative that PAFA plays its full part in the deliberations of a wider Europe and our close involvement with EU industry organisations and its international standing is testimony to the influential role that the Association plays in safeguarding the interests of its members.

TOWARDS A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

Flexible packaging demonstrates exceptional environmental credentials with minimal use of energy and resources in manufacture – much of which is reflected in the savings in transportation and road fuel when replacing heavier materials. PAFA promotes re-use wherever practical and supports integrated waste management systems to optimise recovery and recycling wherever environmentally sound and economical.

PAFA member companies have invested heavily in measures to protect the environment and many have already secured formal ISO or EMAS environmental accreditation for their production sites. But working towards a sustainable future leaves no room for complacency and PAFA works with researchers and equipment designers to reduce environmental impact and energy use at all stages of manufacturing processes and of the supply chain.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

PAFA is a driving force for the continuous improvement of health and safety standards across the industry. Involvement with the Health and Safety Executive and an active Health and Safety group serve to promote the adoption of safe working policies and practices based on rigorous risk assessments and an active exchange of operating experience amongst member companies.

EDUCATING AND INFORMING

PAFA recognises the need to bridge the gap between industry and academia at all levels and is working to develop closer links with schools in the community as well as directly with centres of research across the disciplines. We seek to inspire the vision, imagination and enthusiasm of students to recognise the exciting and rewarding careers all sectors of our industry offer and upon which the future prosperity of the industry ultimately depends.
